

Why Recycle?



It Saves Energy! Recycling one glass container saves enough energy to light a 100 watt light bulb for 4 hours (EPA).

It Saves Trees and Water! Recycling one ton of paper saves 17 trees and 7,000 gallons of water (EPA).

It Leads to Less Waste and Pollutants in the Environment! Instead of being placed in a landfill as waste, each thing you recycle is used to make something new.

It Saves Lawrenceville Money! Recycling costs \$60 less per ton than trash disposal. Each time you place recyclable material in its appropriate bin instead of the trash, you are helping the school to save money.

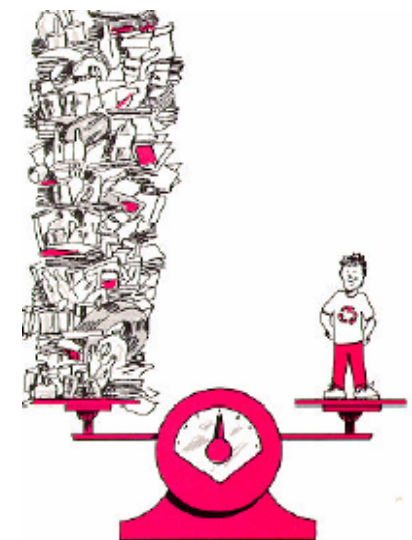

Recycling Tips

 **Deposit your waste in the appropriate receptacle.**

Throughout the Lawrenceville campus, you will find separate recycling bins for paper and containers. The various bins will always be grouped together, so look at the signs posted for each receptacle to be certain of its use.

 **Lids + Liquid= unfit for recycling.**

Remove the lids/caps from all containers, and also rinse them before you recycle.

 **When in doubt, leave it out!** Just one piece of unrecyclable material can make an entire bag unfit for recycling. Follow the rules for recycling that are provided in this guide.

CONTAINERS

DO Recycle:

Glass Food Jars and Bottles


Aluminum and Metal Food and Beverage Containers

Pet Food Cans

Plastic Water and Soda Bottles-- ONLY THOSE MARKED WITH #1 SYMBOL ON THE BOTTOM



PETE (Hold up to light to find symbol)

Plastic Milk, Water, Laundry, Detergent, Bleach, Shampoo and Fabric Softener Bottles—ONLY THOSE MARKED WITH A #2 SYMBOL ON THE BOTTOM 

Paper/Plastic Milk and Juice Cartons

Aseptic Juice Drink Boxes

DO NOT Recycle:

Pie Tins and Aluminum Foil

Window Glass/Drinking Glass, Ceramics

Light Bulbs

Yogurt, Margarine, Sour Cream and Cottage Cheese Containers

Aerosol Cans Marked with #'s 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7

PAPER

DO Recycle:

Newspapers and Inserts

Magazines and Junk Mail

Paper: Stationary, Computer and Copier (of any color)

Boxes: Cereal, Cookie, Cracker, Detergent, Shoe and Gift Boxes (Remove Liner)

Telephone Directories

Paper Bags

Greeting Cards and Wrapping Paper (no foil paper)

DO NOT Recycle:

Carbon, Fax, Plastic Coated, or Waxed Paper

Window Envelopes

Tissue Paper, Napkins, Paper Towels or Paper Plates

Pizza, Soda, or Frozen Food Boxes

Books (Hard or Soft Cover)

Packing Paper
